TBLT is an approach to teaching language where learners are assigned to engage in meaningfocused tasks using the target language

WHAT DOES IT FIND?

- Generally, TBLT is more effective than traditional and non-task-based pedagogies
- TBLT is effective for different settings and different levels
- Claims by opponents of TBLT that TBLT is not as effective in East Asia or younger learners seem to be unsubstantiated

HOW CAN I USE THE FINDINGS IN MY TEACHING?

- Teachers are advised to do needs analyses before selecting / developing language tasks
- It is important to consider task sequence and difficulties
- In contexts where grammar instruction is prevalent, a weak form of TBLT can be implemented, balancing between the focus on form and forms



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
