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

KEY TERM

Automated writing evaluation (AWE)

Feedback that is automatically generated by software after or while learners complete their writing tasks

WHAT DOES IT FIND?

- AWE feedback includes detailed information e.g., verification, error flagging, and strategic guides that can direct learners to reflect on their errors.
- Frequent use of AWE can help learners understand differences between correct and incorrect forms of language use.
- The accuracy of text analysis of AWE varies depending on the range of samples or corpora available.
- Learners are often reluctant to take on suggestions from AWE because AWE is considered to be unreliable when analysing long and complex sentences.
