WHAT DOES IT FIND?

- Implicit instruction, regardless of linguistic complexity, does not seem to be as effective as explicit instruction
- For both simple and complex language features, explicit instruction is more effective than implicit instruction
- Learners' explicit knowledge of complex and simple forms can be developed through explicit instruction
- Explicit instruction can promote learners' ability to communicate spontaneously

HOW CAN I USE THE FINDINGS IN MY TEACHING?

- Both implicit and explicit instructions are useful in different situations and for different individuals. Therefore, teachers should be fully aware of the learners' needs to provide the best form of instruction
- In addition to learners' needs, teachers should also consider the materials and language focuses to be able to choose the best approach which can meet the learners' needs
- Choosing the right instruction can help teachers meet the purpose of the task - whether it is for improving communication skills or knowledge



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
