WHAT DOES IT FIND?

- Cloud-based word processors are widely used to provide technology-mediated feedback.
- Google Docs can encourage dialogues between teachers and learners.
- Multimodal feedback is provided using screencasting software (e.g., Jing).
- Lower-ability ESL learners find screencasting feedback more engaging, useful, and clearer than traditional forms of feedback.

HOW CAN I USE THE FINDINGS IN MY TEACHING?

- Teachers can provide more timely feedback when using technologies.
- Teachers can review learners' responses to technology-mediated feedback to devise the types of follow-up support.
- Teachers can provide a combination of synchronous and asynchronous technology-mediated feedback to create a feedback-rich environment.
